Additional Safeguarding Arrangements from Monday 2nd November

The school continues to review operational arrangements on an ongoing basis. With Covid-19 cases increasing locally and nationally the Governors of Albert Primary School would **recommend and encourage all adults to wear face masks/coverings at drop off and collection times from Monday 2nd November 2020.**

We understand that a number of parents/carers are medically exempt and acknowledge that these individuals would not wear them.

We would continue to ask that all adults on site try to ensure 2m social distancing. In order to reduce congestion on site further, we would like to remind you that only one adult should be coming on to site to collect their children at the end of the day.

We would also ask that should you need to communicate with a class teacher, that this is done via email or phone. Members of the Senior Leadership Team will continue to be on hand at the beginning and end of the school day should you have any more pressing questions or concerns.

The Governors believe this to be the right course of action to further safeguard all members of our school community and continue to allow our school to function as safely as possible.

Thank you to those of you who have offered kind words of support during our first half term; it is very much appreciated.

School closes this week on Thursday 22nd October [INSET DAY—Friday 23rd October] and re-opens on Monday 2nd November.

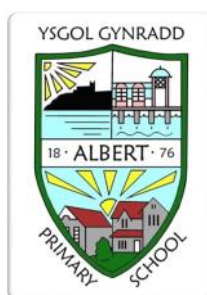
